Evolution and Localization of Public Key Infrastructure and Digital Identity

The Trust over IP (ToIP) Foundation was launched in May 2020 to standardize how people, organizations and the Internet of Things can use digital credentials to form strong, safe, private trust relationships without needing to rely on centralized platforms. This new tool for digital trust has a special relevance for governments and large corporates. As they deal with the impact of COVID-19, governments and large corporates around the world must accelerate their digital transformation. The purpose of this conference is to explain how ToIP can help to reopen businesses stronger; help reduce costs and speed up delivery of public services; help streamline KYC and financial transactions; help connect students with employers needing their skills; and help automate regulatory compliance - all while saving billions in the costs of connecting and protecting digital infrastructure.
